The meeting will include an overview of the study and an introduction to the consultant and study teams, followed by an open house to gather your thoughts and feedback on your travel experiences within and to the area.



Why study the University of New Mexico / Central New Mexico Community College / International Sunport Area?

- It is the largest activity center in the region with a university, a community college, UNM Hospital and Health Sciences Center, and the Albuquerque International Sunport.
- The area attracts approximately 74,000 employees and students a day, with an additional one million annual healthcare patient visits.
- A large amount of development is underway or planned in the area

 including off-campus housing, expansion of the Health
 Sciences Center, and potential mixed use and commercial
 development.
- The area is already served by the very successful Rapid Ride bus lines and many people commute by walking, carpooling, and bicycling, however; North-South transit connections linking important destinations can be improved upon.
